

# Concurrent Enrollment

**Concurrent Enrollment** is an academic program at OHS that allows motivated high school students to take classes here on the high school campus and receive high school AND college credit. There are several types of programs available, and each is offered here at Orem High.

There is a one-time \$35.00 application fee to participate in concurrent enrollment. Credit is offered through UVU and may be used at that institution or transferred to any state college. BYU also accepts concurrent enrollment. It is wise to contact the institution receiving the credit to see how it will be applied.

All concurrent enrollment classes generate a permanent college transcript. **THIS IS IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER. The grades are permanent.** A 3.0 high school GPA is required to participate. Some classes require other prerequisites.

Make sure you meet with an academic advisor to see how the credits apply, which credits transfer, and which classes will best meet your college goals. Call 227-8765 x 208 for this information.

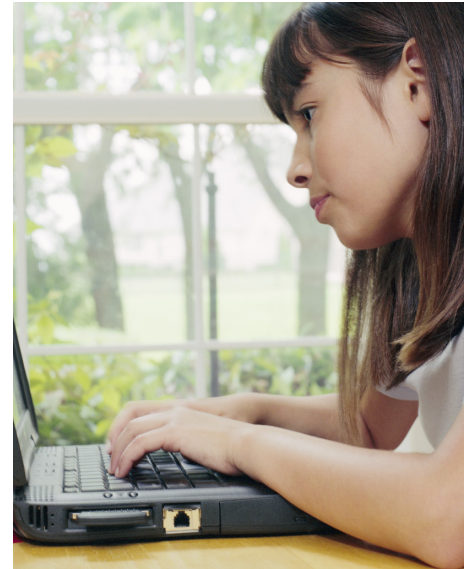

- **HIGH SCHOOL CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT**

These approved classes are taught by high school teachers. Students register for these courses through regular registration at Orem high and also online with UVU. Students must have a 3.0 GPA and in the English sections, meet additional prerequisites. Tuition is waived. Textbooks are provided by the high school. These classes follow the high school A/B and clock schedule.

- **UVU DISTANCE LEARNING**

Professors at UVU broadcast their classes to several off-campus sites, one being Orem High School. The teachers and the students can see and hear each other through television and microphone equipment. These courses are for mature and motivated students who are good self-starters and independent learners. Students register for these courses through regular registration at Orem high and also online with UVU. Tuition is waived. Students must have an excellent attendance record, have a 3.0 cumulative GPA, and in the English and math sections, meet additional prerequisites. These courses do not follow the A/B schedule and students must be willing to meet time schedules set for the classes. Students do purchase required textbooks.



### Advantages

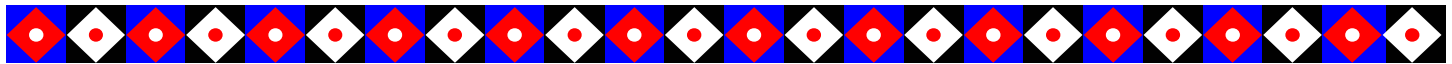
Students who have met their core requirements and are left with elective classes to fulfill graduation requirements are able to take college classes which are academically challenging and advance them toward obtaining a college degree.

Students can take college courses without paying college tuition.

Students can participate in college classes without having to leave the high school. This eliminates transportation problems and worries.

Many students are prepared academically to participate in college courses but do not want to give up the extra-curricular programs and social activities they are involved with in high school. These programs allow students to participate in both.

Students can experience college classes in a familiar and comfortable environment.

### What is concurrent enrollment?

Concurrent Enrollment is an academic program that allows qualified students to take classes at high school during regular school hours and receive both high school and college credit. Classes are offered through Orem High teachers teaching high school classes, UVU professors instructing on our campus, and high school teachers and college professors broadcasting classes to Orem High. These classes can be mixed with a regular high school schedule and high school classes, including advanced placement classes

**How much does it cost?** This is the incredible part. These classes are tuition free! Students must pay a one-time application fee of \$35. Then, they can take as many concurrent classes as they are qualified and able to take. Classes taught by professors require the purchase of additional textbooks.

### Who gives the credit? Can I transfer it?

Orem High is partnered with Utah Valley University. The credit received is through this institution. Credits are transferable to other state colleges. BYU-Idaho and BYU Provo also accepts these credits. Other colleges and universities may accept the credit. It is best to check with the receiving institution to see how credits will be applied.

**Who can take these classes?** A 3.0 GPA is prerequisite for concurrent enrollment classes. Math and English classes have additional requirements. Some classes are reserved for seniors.

**How does this affect my opportunity for scholarships?** If your student takes concurrent enrollment classes, the grades show on both high school and college transcripts. These grades are permanent. Students will still be considered for new-student scholarships when they apply as freshmen at any college or university.

**Know your options. Ask if you have questions. This is a wonderful opportunity for students. See if it works for you.**
