Tele-conference Originating at Lehi High School

A-1 Becky White

MARKETING (CTE) Full Year Grades 11-12 This course provides students with an understanding of basic principles and training for entry-level job positions in business and marketing. The instruction is activity oriented and focuses on the following marketing functions: human relations, communications, selling, buying, free enterprise, advertising/ promotion, finance/accounting, management and business operations, transportation, and warehousing/storage. These skills are then applied to a variety of retail, wholesale, service, and direct-sales enterprises.

AP HUMAN GEOGRAPHY 1 credit Grades 09-12

Curriculum Code HWGA

A-2 Amy Schlauder

Prerequisite: 9th grade must be in G/T program/10-12 grade must have a B average GPA. This course will introduce students to the systematic study of patterns and processes that have shaped human understanding, use and alteration of the Earth's surface. Students will employ spatial concepts and landscape analysis to analyze human social organization and its environmental consequences. Students will also learn about the methods and tools geographers use in their science and practice. The material is designed to prepare the student to take the approved AP Human Geography test.

AP Art History

B-3 Anna Davis

This course covers the history of art from cave art to modern art. It teaches art appreciation and criticism through a historical approach. Painting, sculpture, and architecture are studied in a historical setting which allows the student to understand how the social, economical, political, geographical, and philosophical factors of the time influenced the artists, and therefore their art works. It is a year-long, comprehensive course designed to show how the modern world is a product of all that has come before it. Art, studied in a historical setting, accurately reflects each step along the way. This course is also designed to prepare students to pass the AP Art Exam at the end of the year.

HGCTA (SS, GC)

AP GOVERNMENT & POLITICS

B-4 John Deans

1 credit Grade 11-12

Prerequisite: Good understanding of US History and teacher approval. This course moves at a college level and covers the foundations, structure and operations of the U.S. Government. It is combined with the study of comparative world politics with an emphasis on the governments of China, Iran, Nigeria, Mexico, United Kingdom, European Union, and Russia. Students will gain an understanding of the governmental and legal systems of the United States and insight into the governments of major countries. This is a course that prepares the advanced students for the AP exams in May.
